

All jujubes will need to be planted in full sun and well drained soil. They all start out green and firm, and fully ripen into the reddish brown color shown in the images below. It is common to dry them out like dates and then eat them in their sweetest and softest form. All jujubes have thorns, some bigger than others. Jujubes are not very susceptible to diseases or pests and grow well in our area.


